Our Institution

Khandala Vibhag Shikshan Samiti, Khandala is one of the renowned educational institutes in Western Maharashtra due to its principled and transparent administration.

'**Kin Kin Na Sadhayati Kalpalatev Vidya**' is the motto of our organization. The loss caused by the drought of knowledge is more irreparable than the drought of water. Inspired by the idea that education should reach all levels in the taluka, Rajendra Vidyalaya was established on 1st April, 1951. At that time by giving name of the first President of India to the school, the organization honoured democratic thoughts. Initially, the school had to face many difficulties. Even if the leadership of the organization is, hardworking, restrained and does not compromise on the principle of loyalty to education, the organization has always progressed with the co-operation of Honourable the President, Vice- President, Secretary of this institute.

The plant of knowledge planted at the beginning has turned into a huge Banyan tree today. At present there are 12 high schools including two English medium units, 7 junior colleges, one agriculture college and one senior college. About 4000 students are learning in different branches. There are well - furnished buildings with class rooms, cultural hall, spacious laboratory, library and computer laboratory for each unit. Many of the students who have graduated from this schools/colleges have been successfully working in the fields of medicine, business, engineering, teaching, administration, defence, agriculture, social and political.

Our College

Khandala city is located near Pune Banglore Highway just before Khambataki tunnel in Satara District. Khandala city and surrounding villages are located in hilly area always facing draught conditions.

Rajendra Mahavidyalaya was established by the institute in June 2007 for the purpose of providing quality education upto degree to the students in this area.

Shivaji University has given permission to run, Arts, Commerce and Science faculties in the college on permanent non-grant basis. Considering the need for technical education along with Science and Administrative education at present, the institute also started a vocational B.C.A course on permanent non-grant basis from 2008.

The work of imparting quality education to the girls in this area has been done by Sushila Shankarrao Gadhave, teacher from the same institute. After her, by honouring her Educational work, at the urging of the citizens of Khandala area, Rajendra Mahavidyalaya was renamed as Sushila Shankarrao Gadhave Mahavidyalaya, Khandala from Jun 2019 and the name is approved by Shivaji University on 17th December 2018.

Our college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and is one of the best rural colleges of the university, in terms of academic, cultural, NSS, NCC and sports achievements. At present, there are about 600 students, taking under graduate education in our college. The college imparts education in Arts, commerce and Science faculties along with the degree course in BCA. We have additional Student strength of about 500 under the Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik. At the beginning of the academic year our NSS unit adopt one of the villages for extension activities, like tree plantation, Nirmal gram Yojana, Voters Awareness etc.

The support services of the college include well-equipped science laboratories Library, Playground, Tight security etc. The growth of the college is qualitative as well as quantitative. Our students have excelled in the sports NSS activities at university and occasionally at state levels. Many of our students have occupied good positions in Administration, Teaching, Central and State Defence Services, Industry, Banking. The faculty of our college is well qualified.

Rules and instructions for admission to the college

- 1) Students should use the printed application form in the information leaflet at the time of admission in the college.
- 2) It is necessary to take new admission for further study every year.
- 3) At the time of admission in the first year Arts / Commerce / Science class admission will be given as per the rules laid down by the university.
- 4) Students will be given admission in each class as per the reservation rules made by Government of Maharashtra and University.
- 5) For each class admission will be given only on the basis of previous year's marks.
- 6) The original school leaving certificate collected at the time of admission will not be returned to the student.
- 7) The principal have Final rights regarding the admission in college.
- 8) Every student admitted to the college must have to take admission for one certificate course.

9) The syllabus copy of each and every subject is available in the library, university website as well as in the concerned department.

10) Every student is bound to follow the rules and regulations of the university and college.

12) All the students who are admitted for the first year course are required to attend 50 marks Diagnostic Test.
